BUNGLE IN AWARD OF DECORATIONS FOR R

Many Forwarded by Name Without Any Clue to Name or Regiment.
 London, Dec. 15.—During the war and for some time after it closed, King made a point of summing up his presence all those who had been awarded special decorations for service in course of time the King was not being so numerous that there was impossible to do so every year. The King's list of decorations should be made by the sovereign, and instructions were given by the King, the remainder being given by the names of the recipients. The Times says it now appears that the King has received on the subject that the authorities have gone to other extreme, and that while the lesser decorations are sent out registered post enclosed in envelopes not being sure what it was for, the communication was not accompanied by any communication whatever. The registered parcel is doubtless addressed to the recipient, but it is occasionally nothing to fix the actual ownership of the decoration, since some give no clue to the owner's name or rank.

ARGENTINE PROVINCES UNITE AGAINST CAPITAL.
 Buenos Ayres, Dec. 1.—The Argentine provinces are trying to form a combination against Buenos Ayres, the capital city. Overtures are being conducted between political leaders of some of the provinces for the formation of a league of governments for the purpose of uniting the northern agricultural districts of the country against Buenos Ayres and other coast districts. Some political observers see in this movement an attempt to return to the former division of the country, politically, into opposing sections, while others maintain that it merely is an economic measure having as its purpose the protection of the productive areas.

LATEST LAKE BOAT.
 Sarnia, Ont., Dec. 29.—The steamer A. E. R. Schneider, en route from Marquette to Ashabois, with cargo of ore, passed this port at a slow rate of speed today.
