SEAPLANE TENDERS FOR OCEAN LINERS.


A novel enterprise now being tried by the Navigazione Generale Italiane Company, on their two big motorliners. may effect a general evolution in ocean travel. The Italian company is equipping its new vessels with a launching runway for seaplanes. The military utility of this provision is obvious, but I understand that its strictly commercial uses are deemed no less practical Each liner will carry several seaplanes, and in these craft, flown by expert pilots, passengers in a hurry to reach their destination will, for a commensurate extra fee, be sent on two days ahead of scheduled arrival. Some such scheme as this, now given practical shape for the first time, was envisaged some time ago by Sir Eustace d'Eyncourt to the Institute of Naval Architects, and we may be approaching the day, if the Italian experiment justifies itself, when British liners will regularly carry similar equipment, and the Transatlantic passage will be curtailed still further for yealthy passengers.

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
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
