A. Pemberton, 49 Starley street, on Tuesday of this week. The news came as a great shock and the mother and other members of the family are bowed under their burden of sorrow.

Lawrence Pemberton had many friends in the city. He was known among his chums as "Red." He was 25 years of age and of a bright and cheerful disposition. He was in the sign painting business for a time before he left here early this summer for Lakeport where he had secured a good position as automobile painter.

On leaving home he wrote regularly to his mother until early in July when for Letters auddenly stopped. Several from Mrs. Pemberton were returned to her with the note on the margin that he was not at the address given.
