Mrs. Georganna Dinsmore.
The funeral of Mrs. Georganna Dinsmore took place on Sunday afternoon last, from the residence of her daughter, Mrs. J. F. Carson, Grand Harbour, Grand Manan, where she died. She suffered a paralytic stroke on Tuesday at noon from the effects of which she never recovered. She passed peacefully away on Friday morning at the age of 66 years. Mr. and Mrs. Dinsmore were for years in charge of the fog alarm on Duck Island, also lived at North Head and Mr. Dinsmore is now keeper of Dark Harbour lighthouse. Mrs. Dinsmore had come to spend the winter with her daughter, Mrs. Carson. The services at the house and grave were conducted by the rector of the Anglican parish, Rev. D. Jenkins and interment was made at North Head cemetery. Beside her husband she leaves four daughters, Mrs. Carson of Grand Harbour, Mrs. Peter-Jensen of Lunenburg, Mrs. Marsten of New York, Mrs. Dalsell of Rockland, Me., and two sons, W. James, of Calais, Me., and Chipman, of Head Harbour lighthouse. Alexander Fieveling of North Head is a brother and there are four sisters in Boston.

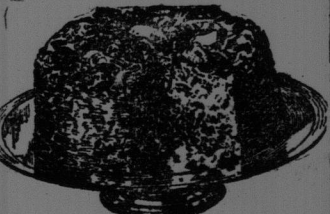
