# FORMER PREMIER PRAISES THE CITY

Hon Crawford Vaughan, formerly premier of South Australia, was an interested and interesting visitor in the city yesterday and in the evening he delivered a powerful address at Chatauqua, advocating a greater measure of democracy as a cure for industrial un-

democracy as a cure for industrial unrest.

Mr. Vaughan spent the morning and afternoon looking about him in St. John and was greatly impressed with the beauty of the situation of the city. Its possibilities as beauty spot in times to come he believed to be unlimited. The waterfront, the rocky prominences of Carleton, and Fort Howe, and the hills of East St. John appealed to him as background of wonderful charm an felt that if too much were not sacrinced to utilitarian ends, the city of St. John might become a second Edinburgh.

His present tour is the first he has made in the maritime provinces and he expressed himself yesterday as greatly struck by their beauty and abundant resources. His own country, Southern Australia, he said, was agricultural and pastoral with an arid region lying not far inland where the annual rainfall amounted to only five inches. The country was, however, redeemed by the large artesian basin which covered an area six times the size of the British Isles. Southern Australia he considered one of the most prosperous of the Australian states with a population of about 460,000.
