## BOTH WOUNDED IN A DUEL IN FRANCE

Paris, Nov. 8.—Charles Lebargey, of the Comedie Francaise, former husband of Miss. Simons, who is now playing in the United States, and M. Malherbe, a journalist, fought a duel. Both men were wounded.

## "BUFFALO BILL"

The Times last week announced the retirement of Colonel Wm. F. Cody, Buffalo Bill, from public life. During a career which began as a pony express rider, led him through more Indian battles than any other living white man, and included twenty-eight years as a show man, Colonel Cody became known as one of the most picturesque figures of American frontier life.

Buffalo Bill, whose adventures have fired the enthusiasm of countless boys and aroused the interest of older people, was born in Scott county, Ia., in 1846. His father was killed in "Border War" in Kansas, and young Cody branched out for himself, becoming a pony express rider in 1866. The following year he became a government scout and guide and was a member of the Seventh Kansas Cavalry from 1868 to 1885.

## GOES IN FOR FIVE YEARS

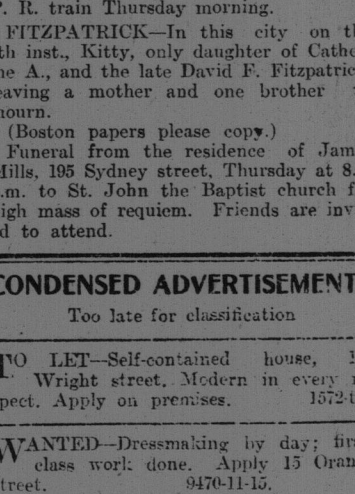

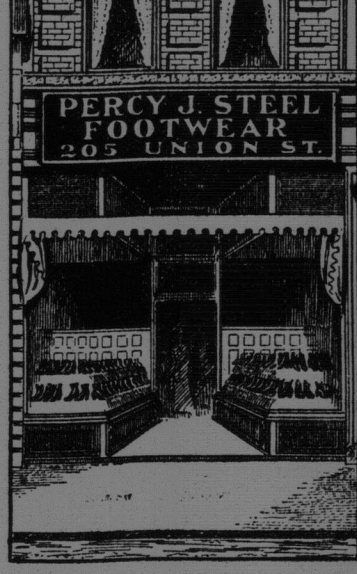
