WHAT THE MARKETS DID

(Toronto Globe) While the supply of live stock has been meagre at the cattle markets during the week, inquiry has shown a tendency to strengthen. The result is an advance in the prices of most grades. The quality of high-grade hogs has been chosen, and from \$7 to \$7.60 has been thought reasonable. Lower grades have been excessively high. The market value of hogs has reached new high levels since a week ago. The supply has been very low. On Thursday as high as \$8.10 was given for them, fed and watered, and just yesterday one dealer gave \$8.10. In sympathy, dressed hogs have moved up to \$10.75. The Easter market in eggs was immense, but has relaxed. It will recover, though, as eggs are one of the cheapest commodities. Butcher has been scarce and prices firm. Potatoes have gone up to \$2. Ontario's are scarce, and the market is strong for Delaware, both here and in the states. Grain merchants have been doing a fair business in Western Canada grain for foreign delivery. The demand from Liverpool will continue strong, as hard wheat is not available elsewhere. Ontario millers are holding their flour, as Australia's is underling them in Liverpool. The steady demand for milled, oats and corn has increased the selling price, and millers are buying with little or no demand. Local supplies of seed fall short of demand. Ontario's supply is large, but of poor quality. Importations are heavy at high cost.

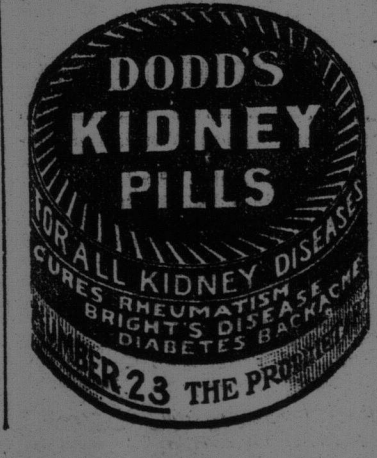
