ELEVATOR SHOOTS DOWN WITH TEN PEOPLE

Several Badly Hurt and Woman Fatally—Lives in Grave Danger

New York, March 24—One man was seriously hurt, two sustained slight injuries, and eight others narrowly escaped death or serious injury, when an elevator in the seven-story building at 394 West 3d street dropped from the third floor to the basement, detaching the 300-pound steel cable from its fastenings at the roof and permitting the great weight of metal to crash down through the grill work roof of the elevator. Joseph Brooks, 29 years old, the elevator operator, started his car upward with 10 passengers, one of them a woman. At the third floor something happened to the mechanism and the car started to settle. Brooks threw on the safety clutch, but it failed to work, and the car started on its descent to the basement. The elevator is of the electric cable type, and when Brooks saw that the safety clutch did not work he seized the cable in a vain effort to stop the car with his own weight. The steel cable was torn from his grasping the skin from his hands, and hurling him against the roof of the car, while not in any degree lessening the speed of the car's descent. When the car struck the bottom it rebounded. The rebound detached the steel cable from the roof and it fell, crashing down the elevator shaft upon the grill work of the car. It tore through the metal top and struck ladore Goodman, knocking him to the floor with a badly lacerated head and several fractured ribs. Joseph Cadizto, who was standing next to Goodman, was also knocked down, but was only slightly hurt. After the crash the cable car settled in the basement. The passengers were in a panic until the woman fainting. Brooks, the operator, thought despite the pain of his lacerated hands, managed to get the car door open and released the passengers. Policeman Seiler arrived just as Brooks got the floor open, and assisted the passengers out. He summoned Dr. Keown with an ambulance from St. Vincent's hospital and lifted the unconscious woman passenger out of the wrecked car. She soon revived and went home, without giving her name. Dr. Keown dressed the wounds of Brooks and Cadizto and took Goodman to the hospital, where it was said later his condition is serious, internal injuries being feared.
