I gave him a hand up the bank from the rink and I had some absorbent cotton in my pocket which I gave to him when I saw he was bleeding at the mouth. The truck that drove the equipment down to the rink took Gnr. Lecompte to the M.I.R. I did not see him again until the following morning. When I went to wake him up, his face and eyes were all swollen. For two days, he was complaining about his sore jaw and could hardly eat anything.
