E. S. Bayne moved its adoption in the ollowing resolution :-

"The synod receives the report and records its gratification, commends the fund to con-gregations and reminds the Presbyterians of their duty to the fund, and allocates \$10,000 to the various presbyteries within the bounds of the synod."

Rev. W. H. Spencer seconded this motion and reminded the presbyteries and pastors that they were responsible for the enlightening of congregations in reference to the aims ad working of this scheme.

It is to be regretted that 3S congregations failed to contribute to this scheme. The ongregation of Woodstock, of which Rev. Mr. Ireland is pastor, was referred to with praise as having become self-sustaining. The committee pa d the grants in full last year without drawing on the reserve fund. The fund is in a very satisfactory state and the synod is gratified that the maritime church has always made such a liberal and intelligent response to its appeals on behaf of one of its most deserving schemes.

The widows' and orphans' fund was sented by Rev. Dr. Sedgwick, in a most encouraging report. He recommended this form of insurance to young ministers as admirably adapted to their peculiar circumstances and as offering better terms than the ordinary insurance companies. The moderator, Rev. Mr. Morton, spoke strongly in support of this scheme and said no student should be allowed to graduate until he had assed an examination on this subject.

Rev. A. Rogers presented the report on the aged and infirm ministers' fund. The sum of \$4,200 was received during this year. There are now 28 annuitants, and the income is insufficient for the demand. Rev. Mr. Rogers recommended that the regulations allowing non-contributors to receive half of the regular amount be rescinded. Only 15 out of 39 ministers in the St. John presbytery belong to this fund, Rev. A. McLean Sinclair moved the re-

eption of this report. He said it was not insurance or benevolent fund, but a church fund and ought to be supported by presbyteries and ministers. Principal Pollok seconded the adoption of the report. He said that he was not connected with this fund, though both aged and infirm, but could see no reason why

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
