SYNOPSIS OF CANADIAN NORTH WEST LAND REGULATIONS.

Any person who is the sole head of a family or any male over 18 years of age, may domesticate a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta, may present a bona fide application in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-agency for the district. Entry by proxy may be made at any Agency or Sub-agency.

Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. A homesteader may live within ten miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 40 acres, or on a homestead occupied by him or by his father, mother, son, daughter, brother or sister.

In certain districts a homesteader in good standing may present a bona fide application for a quarter section of available land alongside his homestead. Price \$10 per acre.

Duties—Must reside upon the homestead or on a portion of it for a period of six years from date of homestead application (including the time required to cultivate homesteaded land) and cultivate fifty acres of it.

A homesteader who has exhausted his homestead right and cannot obtain a pre-emption may enter for a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$2.00 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years, cultivate fifty acres and erect a house worth \$200.
