NEW SAFETY DEVICE IN NEW YORK HARBOR

Cable Sixteen Miles Long Which May be Followed by Ships Equipped With Audiophones.

New York, Aug. 8.—The principle of "follow the green line" used successfully by the management of New York's subway system in handling crowds at congested transfer points has been adapted in a measure to insure safety to ships at sea around crowded harbors.

The device consists of a cable 16 miles long laid in the center of the channel. It is energized with an alternating current from the shore.

This cable is but an additional protection for shipping entering American ports. It supplements the radio compass installed and operated by the Naval Communications service now in successful use all along the Atlantic coast.
