

The Commissioner has ~~again~~
 recently been again called
 to the subject: but up to the present
 time no report has been re-
 ceived from them. The under-
 signed is aware, however, that
 these "outside promises" as they
 are called have been a source
 of general dissatisfaction to the
 Indians and ~~that~~ ^{by the way, I think it likely} that
 they will continue so to be
 unless some ^{final} satisfactory
 settlement can be made
 respecting them.

The undersigned
 thinks it much to be re-
 gretted that the Indians
 were led to expect that they
 would receive anything, be-
 yond what was specially
 mentioned in the Treaty,
 and he respectfully sub-
 mits, that it would be ad-
 visable to increase the
 Amenity of the Indians
 in question from three
 to five dollars, as asked
 for, on the understanding
 that such increase in the
 Amenity should be accepted by the Indians
 in lieu of, and as a ^{final} settle-
 ment for all the so-called
 "outside promises"
