



Mrs. Barber, widow of the late Alexander Barber of Glen Tay, died so what suddenly at the home of her daughter, Mrs. T. G. Robertson, at Lanark, last Wednesday evening, of heart failure. The deceased lady, whose maiden name was Janet Munro, daugh-ter of the late Peter Munro, was born in Bathurst, and was 69 years of age. For some years she has resided amo her sons and daughtsrs.
