

FERRIER, *Lieut.-Col. Hon. JAMES, J.P.* [Victoria.]
(See Senate.)—Montreal.

FRASER DE BERRY, *Hon. JOHN.* [Rougemont.]

Assumed the name of de Berry after that of Fraser, 1867. Was an unsuccessful candidate for Montarville in L. C., Can., 1858. Called to present House, 1867.—*St. Marc, P.Q.*

GINGRAS, *Hon. JEAN ELIE.* [Laurentides.]

An extensive shipbuilder. Sat for Stadacona in Leg. Coun., Can., from 1864 until the Union. Appointed to present House, 1867.—*Quebec.*

HALE, *Hon. EDWARD, D.C.L.* [Wellington.]

Eld. s. of the late Hon. John Hale, a mem of the Leg. Coun. of L. C., by Elizabeth Amherst, sister of the first Earl Amherst. B. in Quebec, 1801. Ed. at Kensington, Eng. M., 1831, Eliza Cecilia, second dau. of the late Hon. Chief Justice Bowen, of Quebec. Is Chancellor of the University of Bishop's College, Lennoxville, and President of the Stanstead and Sherbrooke Mutual Fire Insurance Co. Was Secretary to the Governor General of India, from 1823 to 1828; and a member of the Special Council, L. C., 1839-40. Sat for Sherbrooke in L. A., Can., from g. e. 1841 to g. e. 1847. Appointed to the Leg. Council, P. Q., at the Union, 1867.—*Sherbrooke, P.Q.*

LE BOUTHILLIER, *Lieut.-Col. Hon. JOHN, J.P.*
[Gulf.]

Of French descent. B. in the Island of Jersey, 1797. Ed. there and in Eng. Came to Paspebiac, 1813. M., 1824, Elizabeth, only dau. of the late Philip Robin, Esq., of Gaspé. A merchant. Is Lieut.-Col. commanding 1st. Batt. Gaspé Militia. Sat for Bonaventure in L. A.,
