

may, for their respective sections, appoint a Treasurer and Librarian, if need be.

VIII. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that it shall be lawful for each and every of the several Sections so to be established as aforesaid, to have and to hold regular periodical meetings, and therein, by a majority of votes of the Members present, to make such rules and regulations as may be deemed most conducive to the purposes to this Act, and for the welfare and good government of the said Sections, which rules and regulations being approved by the visitors of the Section which shall have made the same, and not being repugnant to the by-laws, rules and regulations of the said Community or Corporation, shall be binding upon the Members of such Section, subject, nevertheless, to be afterwards repealed, altered or amended, at any subsequent meeting thereof, under the inspection of the said visitors.

IX. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that every person actually admitted, or who shall hereafter be admitted to the practice of the Law as Barrister, Advocate, Solicitor, Attorney or Proctor at Law, in any of His Majesty's Courts of Civil Jurisdiction in this Province, may have one Pupil or Clerk and no more, for the purpose of instructing such pupil or clerk in the knowledge and practice of the Laws of this Province; any law, statute or ordinance in force in this Province, to the contrary in any-wise notwithstanding.

X. And be it further enacted by the authority aforesaid, that from and after the passing of this Act, no person (the persons now admitted to practice in His Majesty's Courts of Civil Jurisdiction in this Province, as Barristers, Advocates, Solicitors, Attorneys and Proctors at Law excepted,) shall be admitted or received to practice as a Barrister, Advocate, Solicitor, Attorney or Proctor at Law, in any of His Majesty's Courts of Civil Jurisdiction in this Province, unless such person shall have been previously entered and admitted into the said Community or Corporation as a Student at Law, and shall have been inscribed in the Books of the said Community or Corporation for and during the full term of five years, and shall have conformed with the By-Laws, Rules and Regulations of the said Community or Corporation, and of the Section established in the District wherein such person shall, during his Clerkship, have resided, and shall have been duly called to the practice of the Law as a Barrister, Advocate, Solicitor, Attorney or Proctor at Law, according to the Constitution and establishment of the said Community or Corporation.
