

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RCMP hypocritical

EDMONTON (CUP) - The RCMP is full of hypocrisy and sick at its core said Jack Ramsey, an ex-RCMP officer and frequent critic of the force, speaking at the University of Alberta February 12.

Speaking of the upper echelons of the force, Ramsey told of Commissioner Higgett meeting Queen Elizabeth and making a speech about honesty and integrity. Shortly after, Ramsey said, Higgett went before Parliament and lied about the RCMP's wiretapping practices.

Ramsey also told of an Edmonton NCO who is being passed over for promotion. The NCO had refused to take an outpost assignment because he has a chronically ill child.

"He had dared to stand up and say: 'No, my family is more important than the force,'" Ramsey said.

RCMP recruits meet a "harsh and unrealistic" attitude when they enter the force, Ramsey said. In some cases the "internal pressures are created that lead members to drinking, suicide and to defy the laws they are paid to enforce."

Ramsey placed the blame on the higher officers. He said they

supply only "token leadership" and are reluctant "to get down to the grass roots level and empathize with their men," resulting in "a dictatorial and very hostile atmosphere."

Ramsey said members' dissatisfaction with their treatment by the force leads them to "lose respect for the administration of the law and the law itself."

The attitude of the force toward the law is becoming more mechanical and members are less willing to use their discretion, he said.

He hypothesized a case in which somebody who was drunk stole a turkey. In the past this person would have been let off with a warning, but now, he claims, he or she would more likely be charged and sent through the courts.

Ramsey attributed this attitude to a federal Treasury Board decision in the mid 1950's to make grants to the forces conditional "on need". "Need" is interpreted as high crime rates according to statistics.

A good police force should have a low arrest rate, Ramsey said. For the RCMP, however, the opposite is true; a low arrest rate means a squad is not doing its job.
