

Nursery school is the answer for apartment dwelling children

The Erindale Co-Op Nursery School will begin its fourth year this fall with classes held in Springbank Community Centre, Mississauga Rd., just north of Dundas Hwy. This solves the problems of parents of pre-school children living in Mississauga in apartments, only children or those having no one to play with.

The Co-Op School, started by mothers with these problems, has two large classrooms and a large sheltered play area. It is staffed by Mrs. Gene Robson, supervisory teacher, a specialist in early childhood education and Mrs. Joan Arends, assistant.

Taking turns, three mothers are on duty each morning, making a ratio of six children per adult. The mothers provide transportation, many sharing a car pool. For information phone registrar, Mrs. Virginia Lucas, 227-3205.
