That your Petitioner himself has had the honour to serve His Majesty ever since the year 1811, when he was appointed, by Commission, which he has still in his possession, Lieutenant and Interpreter in the Indian Department, and that he was subsequently in 1813 advanced to the rank of Captain in the same Department, by a Commission which he had the misfortune to lose when a prisoner among the Americans.

That your Petitioner's personal services in the above capacities were as follows.

On the 15th November 1812, in obedience to the orders of Sir John Johnson, he joined at La Belle, the forces under the late Colonel de Salaberry, and while on that station, he received orders from General de Rottenburg to pursue a party of the Enemy who greatly annoyed our advanced Picket, and with a few of the men under his command he succeeded in taking two prisoners whom he afterwards delivered up to an Officer of the 27th Regiment at Lacadie which fact your Petitioner believes to be within the knowledge of Colonel Starna.

That in the month of March 1813, your Petitioner received orders to proceed to Kingston, which he did accordingly, and remained six weeks in that Garrison during which interval he received his Commission of Captain, above mentioned.

That he was then ordered to Lower Canada, for the purpose of collecting all the men he possibly could, and soon after, returned to Kingston accompanied by 150 men Indians. He has succeeded in mustering at St Regis and
