DISPUTE BETWEEN ETHIOPIA AND ITALY.

Communication from the Italian Government.

Ethiopian atrocities committed upon Italian prisoners.

Charge brought by the Italian Government before the League of Nations.

To the Secretary-General.

(Translated from the Italian).

Following on previous communications, I have the honour to transmit to you copies of the following documents:

- l. Deposition made on February 11th, 1936, in the presence of the Italian Consul at Jibuti, by the Secretary of the Greek Consulate at Dire-dawa, in which he refers to the slave trading noted by him in that town in November 1935, and to the torture and killing of Italian prisoners by Ethiopians (Annex I.).
- 2. Statement made at Cairo on March 10th, 1936, on oath and in the presence of witnesses, by three members of the Egyptian Medical Mission in Ethiopia, concerning the atrocious tortures inflicted at Bolali on December 1st, 1935, on an Italian prisoner who was impaled on an iron bar and then burnt. (Annex II).

The originals of these depositions can be produced, if necessary.

The names of the Egyptian sick attendants concerned are included in the list of the staff of the "Egyptian Committee for Medical Aid in Ethiopia", which was duly communicated to the Italian Government by the Egyptian Legation in Rome.

I would request you to be good enough to bring to the notice of the States Members of the League of Nations these facts, which form a continuation of the series of unheard-of crimes committed in Ethiopia on Italian prisoners in violation of all conventional and humanitarian rules of conduct.
