Sir,-

I have to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 5th instant, enclosing a communication from the Principal of the Chingauk Home regarding the request made to him by Robert Curley for the discharge of his three children.

In reply I beg to say that the Department cannot consent to the discharge of these children and they are to remain in the school. The principal is not to permit these children to leave the school until the sanction of the Department has first been given. These children are receiving every care and attention and it is to their best interests to remain at the school.

You will be good enough to inform the principal accordingly.
