A. I was in Living Hut 2 around 1705 and there was a noise outside. A number of SUS from Living Hut 3 had broken out and someone shouted "come on you fellows, what are you waiting for". Immediately there were 30 SUS in my charge who charged the door and I was pushed outside.
- Q. Did you see the accused?
A. Yes.
- Q. Where was he?
A. With the 30.
- Q. Was there anything you could have done to stop them?
A. No, one man couldn't do very much. I raised the alarm.
- Q. Did you sound the alarm?
A. Yes.
- Q. How do you do that?
A. Just by pushing a bell in the hut.
- Q. Did you see the accused later?
A. Yes, sometime later he was brought back into the hut.
- Q. When they left did you go with them?
A. No, I stayed and guarded the remainder.
- Q. After the accused returned to the hut did he stay there for the rest of the 8th May.
A. Yes, Sir.
- Q. Did you see him on the 9th?
A. Yes, about 0800 hrs or 0830.
- Q. What was he doing?
A. He was carrying a steel bar which had been taken out of one of the windows and I saw him go into #6 Cell Block.
- Q. These bars, how would you describe them?
A. Just a long steel bar.
- Q. About how long?
A. I couldn't say, they are quite a length.
- Q. Did they come out of the windows?
A. Yes.
- Q. Were the windows the same as these windows?
A. No, they are wider but not quite as high.
- Q. Are they about 3/4 as high as these windows?
A. About that, Sir.
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
