N.B.—The following bibliography is restricted to the authors mentioned in the foregoing essay. Some of them had their works published both in England and the United States, and, in a very few instances, I may have quoted from, or referred to, such editions as I possessed before the loss by fire of my original library, instead of those I now have.
