FULL FINANCIAL POWERS VOTED Italian Chamber of Deputies Overwhelmingly Give Government Control.

Rome, Dec. 12.—After a speech in the chamber of deputies yesterday by Premier Salandra, and amid an enthusiastic demonstration, the chamber by a vote of over 400 to 50, approved the bill giving full financial powers to the government for six months. Enrico Ferri, the former Socialist leader, endeavored to oppose the passage of the measure, but was prevented from speaking by the deputies.

HIGH PRICES IN HUNGARY People There Complain Food Costs More Than in Austria and Germany.

London, Dec. 13.—The morning Post-to-day prints a letter from Budapest, which states that more than half a million people have signed a memorandum which will be presented to the Hungarian premier in parliament, representing all classes of the population, complaining of the high price of food. The memorandum claims that prices are much higher in Hungary than in Germany. It asserts that the coming winter will overwhelm the population by starvation, and urges the impossibility of going on under present conditions much longer.

RUSS WINS IN PERSIA Prominent Mohammedan Murdered at Korman.

London, Dec. 13.—Russian troops have defeated a Persian rebel force at Axeh and now are nearing Hamden, according to the Teheran, Persia, correspondent of Reuter's Telegram company. The correspondent states that a plot to assassinate the Persian Minister of Interior, has been discovered. He says it was instigated by refugees and Koum who were hostile to the Entente allies.

The Delhi correspondent of Reuter's Telegram Company stated that Farukh Shah, cousin of the spiritual head of the Mohammedans in India, East Africa and Central Asia, Prince Agakahn, has been murdered by a Persian assassin at Korman, Persia, according to a report received in Delhi from Korman. It is stated that Farukh Shah was travelling in Persia on a spiritual mission.

He was educated at Rottingdean and entered the navy at the age of 13. He served director of naval ordnance, and was made a rear admiral in 1907. In 1910 he was made a lord of the admiralty and controller of the navy. He was knighted in 1911, and last February King George conferred on him the grand cross of the order of the bath. Among the men of the British navy, he is the most popular. He served in the red eagle command, and was the first man to be rammed and sunk in 1893, and was one of the few men saved.
