#### CHEAP LANDS

#### Canada's Mild Winters

In seventy-three years there have  
been fourteen decidedly mild winters.  
The years 1841-42 were the mildest  
with an average of 50.5 for December,  
January, February, March. In the  
winter seasons in 1881-82 and 1889-90  
a mean temperature of 29.9 was  
recorded.

In eight of the fourteen years the  
mild weather in December and Jan-  
uary continued during February, while  
in three of the other years the tem-  
perature was very slightly below  
average, and in three it was consid-  
erably below.
