The Acadia Oreamery and cheese factory is now about ready for operations, no pains have been spared to make this one of the best in the Maritime Provinces. The building is seventy feet by forty feet on the ground. It is situated on the railway grounds near Wolfville station, fronting on Water street. In the west end of the building is the curing room, with a storing capacity of the vetwer tons. In the centre of the building, on the front, is the company's coffice, weighing platform and test room. In the reast of these is the operating room, containing all the plant used in the simple manufacture of butter and cheese. This room is thirty-two feet by forty on the ground. On the cast end is lituated first on the front side a room eight feet square, which will be used for an ice room; next is the butter room or refrigerator, thirteen feet rquare, where the butter will be kept until marketed. In the rear of the refrigerator is the engine room, thirteen by fifteen feet. The capacity of the Factory is about six ton, of milk per day, and the district which
