The Town Building.

The recommendation of the police committee at the last meeting of the town council with regard to the advisability of changing the location of the town building was a good one, and it is to be regretted that so little attention was paid to it.

Talk up Your Town.

The Acadia Creamery and cheese factory is now about ready for operations, no pains have been spared to make this one of the best in the Maritime Provinces.

The vats are to be heated by steam. The churn, separator, and mill, butter worker, and rotary pump will be run by a steam engine.

Finally the most ingenious and reliable piece of mechanism in the establishment is the tester, known as The Steam Turbine Balance Tester. It is very simple in construction and thoroughly accurate in its showing.

Steam is then turned on, the wheel begins to revolve and very soon the butter fat is seen to rise in the tubes, the graduation of which shows the exact percentage of butter fat contained in the given sample of milk.

Everything being ready for operation, with an unlimited market, rich grazing pasture and an abundance of land, there is no reason why this speculation should not prove as successful as similar ones have already proved.

Letter From Shubenacadie.

MR. EDITOR.—When Evangelist Mickle was holding services some two years ago in this place, he organized a men's meeting for ten o'clock every Sunday morning.

Measur Boak and Upham took part in the evening services at the Presbyterian church. The great tension of the audience had another strain when near the time the Rev. Mr. Turner, Methodist, pale and anxious looking, entered and whispered to the leader, who, asking that another verse be sung, at once retired with the caller.

Two brothers, John F. Lantz aged 24 years, and Josephus Lantz aged 17 years, were drowned in the Shubenacadie river, near Milford station. A brother was present in his employer's pew. Men were called for to search for the bodies, which were found before dark forty feet apart in a deep pool.

About fifty years ago a lad named Gaul, of Rawdon, boarding at the late John Johnson's, was drowned while bathing alone in the shallow waters of the College or Johnson brook, Wolfville. The late Eliza DeWolf was the coroner.

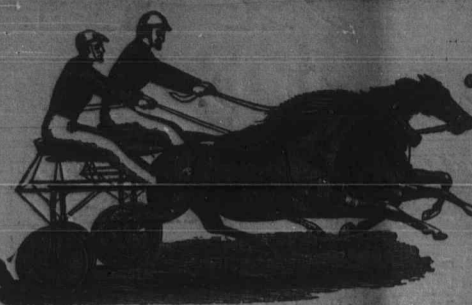
Mr. Anthony's new house on Central Main street, is a fine addition to the appearance of that locality.
