baby it is better to prepare the feedings for the whole trip at home. You can sterilize the milk for this purpose as follows: Stand the filled bottles in a kettle over the fire and let the water boil for about an hour and a half. After boiling, the bottles should be gradually cooled and then made as cold as possible by standing them in a pail of cracked ice. A good portable ice box for such a

journey may be made at home as follows: Use two covered tin pails, one an inch or two smaller than the other so it may stand inside the larger pail east Fill the space between the two with sawdust, put the bottles with cracked ice in the inner pail and cover both tightly, making a canvas or flannel cover for the whole. To warm the bot-tle for baby you should carry an enameled ware pitcher which the porter will fill with warm water and you can set the bottle in that until warm enough for feeding.
