

LABEL HUNS HOPE TO USE.

Unblushing Germany is getting ready for trade with Britain again. An officer with the Army of Occupation has sent to this journal a collection of recently printed labels bearing the familiar words "Made in Germany."

The labels, intended for the covers of boxes containing razors, scissors, and other cutlery, are gaily printed in red, gold, green, and black, and read as follows:

Superior scissors made of the best double refined cast-steel. Made in Germany.

Finest hollow-ground razors set ready for use; warranted. Made in Germany.

Stahschmidt Tool Co., Ltd., Oremfeld, near Elberfeld, Germany. Hardware and tools of high-class quality. Trade-mark, "Feda."

Antoni's Razors fine razors; warranted English steel. Made in Germany.

Celebrated razors; best quality; warranted. Made in Germany.

A Board of Trade official to whom the labels were shown expressed great interest in them, and asked that they might be left for further inspection.

"There has been," he said, "no change in the regulations affecting imports from Germany, nor can there be until the Government has made a decision. We do not find that the German manufacturers are yet trying to get goods through, but it is interesting to see how thoroughly they are preparing for trade again."—Daily Mail.
