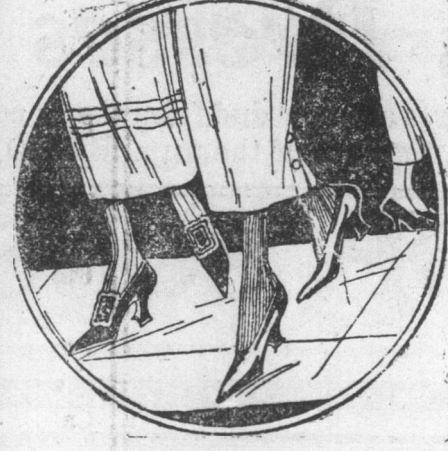

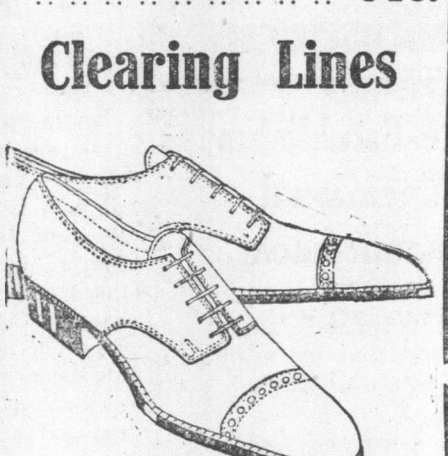

The sports programme, conducted by Mr. W. J. Higgins, M.H.A., assisted by Councillors N. J. Vinnicombe and H. J. Brownrigg, Major Carty and Messrs F. Pippy and T. Curran, was as follows:—

Baseball (Jrs.)—St. Patrick's vs. Young Wanderers. Won by St. Patrick's by 14 runs to 8.

Baseball, final—For H. D. Reid Cup Cubs vs. Wanderers. Won by the Cubs by 13 runs to 2.

Football Fives, (1st round)—C.C.C. won from Saints by 3 goals and 2 corners to 0.

Star won from C.E.I. by 1 goal to 1 corner.

Collegians won from B.I.S. by 3 goals and 1 corner, to 1 goal and 1 corner.

The different events created much interest, particularly the pony race. In the baseball contest the Juniors gave a fine exhibition and the Cubs captured the H. D. Reid cup "for keeps" having won it two years in succession. During the afternoon ladies interested in the welfare of Mount Cashel served tea and refreshments. Other attractions were the dancing by the lads of the institution and drills, which were nicely gone through. The C.C.C. and T.A. bands rendered splendid music during the afternoon. At the conclusion of the party the prizes were distributed by Rev. Bro. Ennis. The winning football team consisted of Duggan, Hart, Kavanagh, Simms and F. Brian. The baseball cup was received on behalf of the Cubs by Mr. Claude Hall, pitcher of the team. Those who assisted in carrying out the days programme were then entertained in the Orphanage by the Brothers, Mr. J. Slattery who had been Chairman on such occasions some 19 years presiding. He had great pleasure in announcing the following record gate and games receipts: Gate, \$627.53, against \$492.65 for last year; hitting old man \$50.65, against \$46.85; billiards, \$50.60, against \$25; whips and knives, \$77.40, against \$61.00; cigarette diamond, \$51.00; baseball shyness \$146.17, against \$101.00, making a total of \$1015.34, compared with \$740.63 for the previous year.

The passing of votes of thanks to the ladies' and the press, and the singing of the National Anthem brought the proceedings to a close.

Obituary.

MICHAEL J. DONNELLY.

The sad news that Michael J. Donnelly had passed away, came as a shock yesterday afternoon to his many friends. He had been ill only since Friday last, but on Tuesday developed pneumonia and was conveyed to the Southcot Hospital where the end came about 4 p.m. yesterday. Deceased was a son of the late Mr. Donnelly, of Hon. G. Knowling's employ. He was a prominent member of the R. C. Cathedral choir and also a member of the B.I.S. For a number of years he was an officer in the C.C.C. His brother, Capt. Jas. Donnelly, M.C., of "Ours," who was the first Newfoundland to win a distinction with the Regiment, was killed in action in France. Left to mourn are his mother and one son, his wife having predeceased him. To them the Telegram extends sympathy.

Smallpox at Colinet.
