TO-DAY'S MESSAGES.

PENSION BILL PASSES SECOND READING.

LONDON, May 19.
The House of Commons to-night passed the second reading of the Government's Pensions Bill 401 to 125. The House first rejected the Labor amendment moved by J. Wheatley, the former Labor Minister of Health, declining to give second reading to a bill which exacts contributions from the wage earners and imposes an additional burden on industry. The bill, which embodies Winston Churchill's Budget Insurance plan for granting pensions to widows, will now be referred to the Committee of the Whole House. The principal feature of to-night's debate was the unexpected attack on the measure by Sir Robert Stevenson Home, former Chancellor of the Exchequer in the Coalition Government, whom it had been supposed Premier Baldwin might eventually invite to enter the Cabinet. It is recalled that the Prime Minister did invite Sir Robert Home to join his Government as Labor Minister, but that Sir Robert, expecting to be appointed Chancellor of the Exchequer, declined what he considered a minor office. It is believed that his attack on the Government has spoiled any future chance Sir Robert might have had of joining the Government. He has important business interests, however, and may not be anxious to take a ministerial office.

FRENCH AWAIT ABD-EL-KRIM'S NEXT MOVE.

PARIS, May 20.
French forces in four groups are now in the positions in Morocco assigned to them by General Count De Chambrun, and aside from such local actions as are necessary to prevent the Rifians from slipping through between them, they will await the next move of Abd-el-Krim, leader of the rebel tribesmen. This is the latest report received from Northern Africa. A new column of French, commanded by General Elle Billet, which arrived yesterday, has taken up a position where it can watch the movements of the Rifians concentrated near Sheshuan, known as the "Holy City of Xauen."

J. H. THOMAS DELIVERS A MESSAGE TO THE EMPIRE.

LONDON, May 19.
The Overseas Settlement Department of the Colonial Office this evening issued a message written by J. H. Thomas, who was Secretary for the Colonies in the Ramsay MacDonald Cabinet, addressed to "my fellow citizens in the Dominions and Great Britain." Mr. Thomas opens by stating that he is aware there are many people who assume that the Labor leaders are against the development of the Empire. "It is because I am a Labor man that I believe with all my heart in that great brotherhood of free Democratic peoples, which is building up the British Empire." Dealing with the capabilities of the Dominions and the smallness of their populations, he expressed himself at length on the latter problem, and asks if the British people do not see that the existence of the Dominions as nations depends upon having them populated to a much greater extent. Canada, he said, must have more people and five or six millions of British could not hold Australia. The success of the white Australia policy depends upon having more inhabitants.

UNION MINES CEASE WORK.

PITTSBURGH, Pa., May 19.
All of the Pittsburgh Coal Company's Union mines are now closed, the Company announced to-night. Forest Hill Mine, near West Newton, employing 400 men which closed to-day, was the last to go down. Two years ago the Company had fifty mines working employing 17,000 men. They produced 1,500,000 tons of coal monthly. A solution of the present difficulties of increased cost had been found, the Company said, by some of its Union miners of Pomeroy, Ohio, who three weeks ago agreed to work on the November, 1924 wage scale.

HOTEL PROPRIETORS' RESPONSIBILITY.

WINDSOR, Ont., May 20.
Hotel proprietors on the border have received police notification that the proprietors of premises on which 44 per cent. beer is sold after next Thursday will be held responsible for any disturbances that may occur.

COMMUNIST DELEGATES SEVE OUT.

LONDON, May 20.
Representatives of the British Government refused to admit delegates from Russia and other European countries who proposed to attend the annual conference of the British Communist Party opening at Glasgow on May 30.

SEEKS REFUGE IN PRISON.

WASHINGTON, D.C., May 20.
Gaston B. Jones, an investigator extraordinary and central figure in many sensational episodes of recent United States history, has sought refuge within the walls of Atlanta Federal Prison, seeking sanctuary from yesterday's Supreme Court when he asked to be allowed to serve two years sentence

imposed in New York in connection with illegal whiskey withdrawals.

ATLANTIC FLIGHT THIS SUMMER.

NEW YORK, May 20.
The determination of two French Army pilots to risk the hazards of a non-stop flight between France and America in a single-motored biplane this summer, was confirmed to-day by Charles F. Norcross, Editor of the World Traveller Magazine, on his ar-

rival aboard the liner Minnewaska.

JAMAICA MAKES DRASTIC IMMIGRATION REGULATIONS.

KINGSTON, J.A., May 20.
Following much public clamor the Government has decided to take drastic steps to control immigration. Aliens in future will have to produce passports from the British Consul at the port of their embarkation before they are allowed to land here. The measure

aims especially at Chinese and Syrians who have been monopolizing the islands trade.

INDICTED FOR BABY SUBSTITUTION.

NEW YORK, May 20.
The first indictment for baby substitution in 242 years of New York Criminal Courts was returned yesterday against Mrs. Helen Augustea Gustin Folk, a former German Red

Cross nurse and the proprietor of East 46th St. Baby Farm, by the Grand Jury.

RUM ROW DISAPPEARING.

NEW YORK, May 20.
Reports from Halifax that thirteen former rum running steamers and schooners are docked there, was taken by the dry enforcement officials to-day as confirmation of the statements that the North Atlantic rum row was being cleaned out by the blockade.

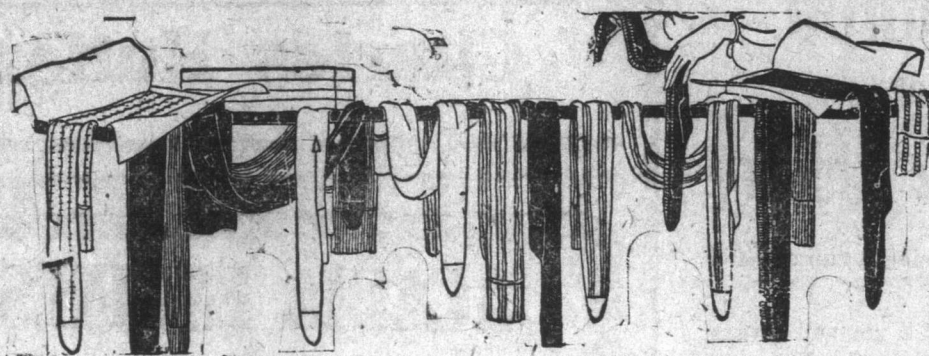
