The Wire-worm in Wheat.—Mr. John Scott of Puslinch showed us the other day a bunch of wheat stalks which he had taken out of a field on Mr. James Eagle's and other farms along the road, and which when examined was found to be seriously affected by the wire-worm. On peeling off the leaves from almost every stalk, two or three, and in some cases more than a dozen of these insects were found, which in time would have sucked the life sap out of the plant, and either killed it altogether or left it a puny, sickly stalk, which would nover amount to anything. On one of these stalks we counted no less than 30 worms. Mr. Scott in forms us that some fields which he passed are beginning to get quite yellow already from the ravages of this pest. The damage done is greatest on the early sown spring and fall wheat, the later sown having almost escaped. We are sorry to learn that so many fields in Puslinch are likely to be greatly injured by this worm, and that some farmers do not look for more than half a crop. We trust their fears may prove groundless, but from what we hear of the ravages of this in-sect in other parts of the Province we are forced to the conclusion that they are more general and destructive than many imagine.
