Now that effect will largely be undone. Foreign nations will not study the details of the con-troversy between the two parties in Canada. They will probably pay little attention to the Liberal plan for creat-ing fleet units. What will impress them will be the apparent refusal of the Canadian legislature to sanction the proposal for helping to strengthen the naval resources of the empire. By Britain's rivals and enemies the decls-Britain's rivals and enemies the decis ion will be eagerly welcomed; by her friends it will be regarded as ominous. evitably created that the solidarity the empire is but a myth; that th sea-power which would like to see the everthrow of the British naval su-premacy, need not be discouraged by the thought that their challenge would be met by the united resources of the mother country and daughter states. Such an impression, too, must be heightened by the doctrine advanced by the opposition to justify their re-fusal to provide three battleships for the imperial fleet. the imperial fleet. "The naval strength of the empire, be maintained at all must, however, be maintained at all costs. If the Canadian government is for the moment unable to provide ships, the government of the United Kingdom must act in its place. Mr. Churchill has said that whatever de-cision is made by Canada, Great Britain will not under any circumstances fail in her duty to, the over-seas defail in her duty to, the over-seas de-minions. "It is now incumbent upon him to make good his assurance." The Daily Graphic upholds the action of the Canadian senators as being en-tirely constitutional and points out that Premier Borden won the last elec-tion largely on the reciprocity issue. He has since brought forward a far-reaching proposal on an entirely dis-connected issue, and has forced his bill through the Dominion house of commons by the aid of his party ma-fority. commons by the aid of his party ma-jority. The senate legitimately refuses to pass the bill until the country has been canvassed. Why Premier Bor-den refuses to consult the country by means of a referendum is not easy to understand.
