World's W. C. T. U.

Tenth Annual Gathering of Delegates at Toronto.

Opening Sessions—Progress of the Work—Interesting Reports and Pertinent Suggestions.

Toronto, Oct. 22.—A huge audience filled the pavilion last evening. It was the first "Purity Conference" of the Dominion W. C. T. U. convention. The president, Mrs. Rutherford, was superceder for the time being in her duties by Dr. Mary Wood-Allen, national superintendent of the purity department, Ann Arbor, Mich.

Miss Willard, president of the World's W. C. T. U., confined herself to a pleasant little address, saluting with "Brothers and sisters of the larger hope," yet they ran a good deal faster when somebody was after them. The white ribbons were bound to demolish the opium traffic, the liquor traffic and vice.

Mrs. Ada Marian Hughes followed with a paper on "The Co-operation of Mothers and Teachers in the Training of Pure Men and Women."

Mrs. Amelia Yeomans dealt on "Methods of Treatment of Outcast Girls."

Mrs. Charlton Edholm, Chicago, made a strong appeal for aid for the Florence Crittenton Mission. She could see no reason why the 20,000 Christians in America could not relieve the 250,000 erring girls from white slavery.

Mrs. John Harvie, of this city, was heard on behalf of dependent children.

The concluding address came from the lips of Rev. C. J. Eaton, who would set about reformation from a sociological standpoint. He would not allow laws to give girls who made out \$2.50 a week, and had to dress well, enough to live on, and it would be easier to save them.

WEDNESDAY AFTERNOON SESSION.

At the afternoon session, Miss Wiggins, chairman of the world's convention committee, extended a hearty welcome to the visiting delegates.

The treasurer's statement, presented by Mrs. Tilton, showed total receipts \$1,645.26, amount on hand \$721.32.

Mrs. Adkinson, of Montreal, N. B., read the secretary's report. The present membership of the Dominion is 10,010, being an increase of 1,712 for the year; 62 new unions have been organized. Some 183 Bands of Hope belong to the Dominion Union, with 9,789 members. The annual income of provincial unions (British Columbia not reporting) is \$2,589.74.

Mrs. Tilton read an interesting and favorable report of juvenile work.

Mrs. Rutherford, the president, was listened to with the greatest attention throughout her annual address.

One after another the various departments of work were surveyed by the speaker, bringing "mothers' meetings" and "juvenile work" into prominence as very important.

Her address Mrs. Rutherford spoke very earnestly, and said that the greatest need of the hour was to believe for each woman to understand her individual responsibility and the wearing of the little white ribbon means.

A standing vote of thanks was gratefully given the president for her address.
