**The Diamond Thief Will Spend Two Christmases in Prison.**

William Hilbert, alias Capt. Waldeck, who is well-known here, pleaded guilty before Judge Biddle in the Quarter Sessions Court at Philadelphia to the larceny of a diamond ring from the store of

Detective Henderson testified that on the evening of Dec. 15 "Capt. Waldeck" and his wife entered the store of Bailey, Banks & Biddle, and while pretending to make a purchase removed a diamond ring from a tray and deftly replaced it with a paste one.

Henderson followed the couple out of the store and into Wanamaker's, where the "captain," discovering that he was being shadowed, got rid of the ring by throwing it among a pile of silks on one of the counters.

When searched at the central station two diamond pins, which had been stolen in Baltimore, a watch with a claimant in Buffalo, and a ring from Washington were found in the "captain's" possession.

Judge Biddle imposed a sentence of two

years and eight months in the Eastern Penitentiary.
