## REDS WELCOME PERSIAN REBEL

Moscow Offers Refuge to Ehsanulla, Who Nearly Captured Teheran.

MOSCOW, Feb. 23.-Ehsanulla, the chief of the red revolutionary movement of Persia, who last June made a daring raid that all but succeeded in capturing Teheran, has escaped the shah's Cossacks and is now here. 'The people's struggle against the shah and the feudal landlords has failed. There'll be no more," he said. His comrade leaders in the revolution

Ehsanulla is rated the most picturesque figure of all the bandit and revolutionary leaders of the Middle

Educated and daring, for 16 years he has fought the established order in Persia. His long hair and shaggy beard are known to thousands of

Persian peasants.

He is known as the Karl Marx of
