REDS WELCOME PERSIAN REBEL

Moscow Offers Refuge to Ehsanulla, Who Nearly Captured Teheran.

MOSCOW, Feb. 23.—Ehsanulla, the chief of the red revolutionary movement of Persia, who last June made a daring raid that all but succeeded in capturing Teheran, has escaped the shah's Cossacks and is now here. "The people's struggle against the shah and the feudal landlords has failed. There'll be no more," he said. His comrade leaders in the revolution were killed. Ehsanulla is rated the most picturesque figure of all the bandit and revolutionary leaders of the Middle East. Educated and daring, for 16 years he has fought the established order in Persia. His long hair and shaggy beard are known to thousands of Persian peasants. He is known as the Karl Marx of Persia, but in many ways resembles Makno, the present leader of South

Russia. He has never been captured, though he has taken part in every armed struggle of Persia since 1905. He might now be master of Teheran and of Persia but for quarrels between two of his associate leaders, Kutchik and Haidar. Rallied Peasant Army. With a peasant army strengthened by Russian Communists, he struck from Rescht to Teheran, while many of the shah's 50,000 troops were putting down risings at Tabriz and at Hordasah and was within 35 miles of Teheran when a betrayal by his own ranks gave news of his whereabouts and forced his retreat. "After the Anglo-Russian treaty, by which both nations agreed to leave Russia alone," said Ehsanulla, "I realized that the Sayyid Zia-u-Din government was a reversion to the old, corrupt law of the feudalists, each of whom is a sort of a little shah, and that the rule of the combined peasantry and educated class would go under, perhaps forever, unless I made a last desperate effort. "So I got together a few thousand peasant soldiery and by secret paths and rapid marching tried to reach Teheran. The Cossacks of the shah began to attack me and the Russian Communists with me lost heart. I fought until I was surrounded and then retreated. "An Englishman no longer dare

to go into North Persia, but this is not much satisfaction for me since they will again be in control in Teheran. My pity is for the poor peasants. I built schools and hospitals for them. "There need be no fear that Persia will join the Pan-Islamic union projected by Enver Pasha. The Islamic religion has ruined the Orient and we have no desire to form a union that would again place us in subjection to the Turks."

RED REVOLT IN PERSIA FAILS

Communists Claim Feudalist System Makes Nationalist Reforms Difficult.

BAKU, Azerbaijan Feb. 23.—The last of the Russian Communists have arrived here from Persia, fleeing before the troops of the shah, under the general direction of Prime Minister Ghavamos Saltane, who demanded that the terms of the Anglo-Russian treaty for both nations to let Persia work out her own destiny

be observed. Rotstein, the Soviet ambassador to Teheran, has been sent home, among others. The invasion of Persia was undertaken in 1920, the Russian Communists co-operating with three revolutionary bandit chiefs of Persia—Ehsanulla, Kutchik and Haidar. The failure of the movement is attributed here to quarrels between the three bandit chiefs. Now that the effort of Soviet Russia to sovietize Persia has definitely failed, the Russians are taking a rather impartial if not cynical view of the events there during the past year. They maintain that the 60 or so little shahs, or feudalist landlords, each with his court and army, continue to weaken the central government by their quarrels and ambitions and that so long as they have any power, no nationalist movement is possible and Persia will remain in the same condition as England of centuries ago under the barons. Aside from the Anglo-Russian treaty, a multitude of reasons are given for the red failure in Persia. One is that the soviet freedom to women including abandoning of the chadrah, or veil, pleased the women but not their husbands and made many enemies for the soviet. Another reason was that the Russians mistook the feudalists for reformers. These persons were ready for any revolution that would over-

throw the power of the shah, until they realized that Communism would wreck their own estates.

Business Tips

Steel ingot production now is more than twice as big as last July, when the industry hit bottom and started its slow saw-tooth upward movement.

Steel output is 76 per cent as large as in 1913. Mills are averaging around 45 per cent capacity. Difference in percentages is due to increase in productive capacity during the last eight years.

LUMBER. Lumber mills in the northwest report production nearing four-fifths of normal. New business is at about the same rate.

BEAR.

Market price of leading representative of securities has slumped 24 per cent since the peak of early July, 1919.

Three-fourths of Mexico's oil output, now near the record, is flowing into United States. This continues as a bear influence. Veteran operators believe that Mexico will be a tremendous crude producer for years, despite wells going to salt in some fields. Many new fields may be opened. Mexico is far from being thoroughly yild-catted.
