

London, D cember 21.—There has just been received through Sir John Kirs, British Consul-General to Zanzibar, the following copy of a letter from the Mahdi to his Governor-General of Equatorial Africa, giving details of the capture of Khartoum. The letter is dated April 28, 1998.

1885:--'I hform you, my dear friend, that ac-cording to the fulfilled promise of God the city of Khartoum was entered by the help of God January 29, 1885, at daybreak, through the helpers of our religion, who were rearry and jumped over ditches, act-ing upon command of the Lord, who rules the whole world. 




