SCENE AT THE SCAFFOLD.

Thomas Kane's Neck Not Broken—With Fortitude He Went to His Fate—He Had Nothing to Say—His Struggle With Death—The Struggle Lasted 15 Minutes—The Executioner's Return in Order—A Sensible Foreman.

Thomas Kane was strangled yesterday. His neck was not broken. The "improved" engine of death is apparently incapable of accomplishing this.

Death is the penalty of murder, not torture. Harvey at Guelph was in his death throes for the space of 15 minutes; Kane yesterday was alive 15 minutes after he had in this new fashion "jerked up."

It is surprising that the foreman of the jury suggested an official condemnation of this system of hanging which seemed so strongly to shock the public mind.
