STOCKS QUIET AND FIRMER.
THE WHEAT MARKETS CLOSE PRAC TIONALLY HIGHER.

London Stocks and Bonds-The Money Market-Europe's Wheat Requirements-Grain and Flour-Production and Provisions-Reserve Bank's Report-Liverpool Markets-N.Y. Cotton Exchange.

SATURDAY EVENING, AUG. 8. Bradstreet estimates that the importing countries of Europe will this year require 21,000,000 bushels of wheat.

The weekly statement of the New York banks is again unfavorable, the variations being: Reserve, decrease \$1,000,000; loans, increase \$1,470,000; deposits, decrease \$500,000; circulation, increase \$23,000.

In the week the Bank of England lost 250,000 million, but the rate of discount for liabilities was raised from 4 1/2 to 5 per cent, against a decline from 5 1/2 to 5 per cent in the corresponding week last year, when its discount rate was 5 per cent.
