GRAND OPERA HOUSE.

The beginning of this year leaving an estate alued at \$56,000. Legacies were left to several charitable institutions as fol-lows: Protestant Orphans' Home \$200, Hill Crest Convalescent House \$400, Queen-street Methodist Church \$100, Methodist Superan-nuated Ministers Fund \$300, Sick Children's Hospital \$300, Home for Incurables \$500, Newsboys' Home \$200, Toronto Prison Gate Mission \$100, Brantford Blind Institution \$100, and legacies to relatives amounting to \$13,852. By a codicil she directed the residue of her property, real and personal, to be divided amongst the charitable institutions above mentioned in the proportions above set out. The property increased considerably refore her death and now amounts to over \$40,000, about half of which is realty. Some of the above institutions have no power to hold realty, and the question arises what is to be done with such shares. The suit is brought against those institutions interested under the will by the executors of the de-ceased. Judgment was given in terms of consent by which the costs of the adminis-tration action and proceedings, are to be paid, then one-third of the residue goes to

There were 11 counsel in the case. Mrs, Eagle thought she had disposed of her estate by her will, and the large residue is due principally to rise in real estate.
