PARLIAMENTARY NOTICE.

Notice is hereby given that application will be made by the Suprems Court of the Independent Order of Foresters, to the Parliament of Canada, at the next session thereof, for the passage of an Act in amendment of its Act of Incorporation, 52 Victoria, chapter 104, entitled "An Act to Incorporate the Supreme Court of the Independent Order of Foresters," and that the nature and object of the proposed Act, are as follows, to wit:

1. To amend Section "1 (e)" of the said Act of Incorporation by striking out the word "three" and inserting in lieu thereof the word "five," thus granting to the Supreme Court power to increase the maximum Mortuary Bentilts which may be paid to the beneficiaries of its deceased members from three thousand to five thousand dollars.

2. To amend Section 6 of the said Act of Incorporation by adding provisions granting power and authority to the said Supreme Court, Independent Order of Foresters, in addition to the powers and authority granted to them by the said section to invest so much of the "surplus" or accumu-lated funds of the said Supreme Cour-in bonds of the United States of Am-erica, or of any State thereof, as may be provided for or required from States, or in any State or Territory thereof; provided that the aggregate of such investments shall not at any time exceed one-fourth of the total availbale "surpins" or accumulated funds of the said Supreme Court; also to give power to the Supreme Court to procure and deposit with the proper authorities or departments of the Government of Great Britain or of any of the countries other than the United States of America, in which the Supreme Court, now doing or may hereafter do business, such securities as may be required of Fraternal Benefit Societies or Insurance Companies, by the laws of such countries; provided always that the total of such securities
