On referring to the returns it will be perceived that some of the divisions exhibit a large decrease in their membership, consequent upon expulsion for non-payment of dues. ACADIA Division, No. 1. I regret to say, is about going down. There is no hope of sustaining it. Some of the Divisions appear to be making no progress, and, unless the memters arouse themselves to action, it is feared they will soon be in a languishing condition. Among them I might mention COLUMBIA, No. 243 LEXEMBURG, NO. 60; KELLOGG, NO. 92; EVENING STAR, NO. 97; LOWER HORTON, NO. 122; VESPER, NO. 124.
