It will be a long time before the story of the war in South Africa can be written fully and impartially. Until, then, the very meagre military despatches are supplemented by much fuller details, anything like an accurate history of the war would be impossible. Fortunately, this is not a history, but a story to which the war forms the background; and, as is necessary in such a case, it is the heroes of my tale-the little band of lads from Johannesburg—rather than the leaders of the British troops. who are the most conspicuous characters in the narrative.

He goes through many stirring adventures, successfully carries out several dangerous missions in Spain, saves a large portion of the French army at Oudenarde, and even has the audacity to kidnap the Prime Minister of England. Full from cover to cover of exciting and heroic incidents, the story is one to appeal to the healthiest and best instincts of boyhood.

Out with Garibaldi«

A Story of the Liberation of Italy.

One of the most romantic episodes in history is the liberation of Italy by Garibaldi, who, with only a thousand followers, invaded Sicily, and with a force of ill-armed irregulars, who flocked to his standard as he advanced, defeated a trained army of a hundred thousand men. The hero, Frank Percival, is an English lad, whose father and grandfather have been secretly imprisoned by the Neapolitan government. He carries to Garibaldi a large sum of money to help the expedition, which he joins as a lieutenant on the general's staff, and takes a prominent part in the extraordinary series of operations that ended in the fall of the Neapolitan kingdom. Finally, he succeeds in rescuing his relatives from Neapolitan prisons, and returns to England after the fall of the capital.
