n the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Customs on the recommendation of the Honourable the Minister of Customs and under the authority of the Act 31 Vic., Cap. 6, Sec. 4, entitled: "An Act respecting the Customs," His Excellency has been pleased to order, and it is bereby ordered, that from and after the date thereof, the following articles when imported into Cauada, or taken out of Warehouses for consumption therein—that is to say: Spirits and Strong Waters mixed with any ingredient or ingredients, and although thereby, coming under the denomination of Proprietry Medicines, Tinetures, Essences, Extracts, or any other denomination, shall be, and they are hereby declared to be chargeable with the duty imposed by the 3rd section of the Act 33 Vic., cap. 9, and with no other Customs duty.
