A. INTERNATIONAL CO-OPERATION IN SOCIAL WELFARE

A total of some \$320 million is being made available by Canada for six developing countries through the Canadian Development Fund, the International Development Association Bank and the Asian Development Bank. Of this amount some \$13 million is allocated to the Social Welfare and Related Fields, including UNICEF.

The Canadian assistance programme is responding to needs from developing countries. Under its programme of Canadian funds available to senior officials, some \$100 million would be disbursed in developing countries, while

In addition to its six programmes, Canada participates extensively in the social development activities of the United Nations through cooperation with the Commission for Social Development, UNICEF and other agencies connected with social matters. Reports on documentation for the United Nations and the Specialized Agencies are prepared on Canadian experience as leader. In the same way, Canada participates in and contributes to the work of the International Conference on Social Welfare and other international agencies.

Canada extends bilateral assistance to some 60 countries of Africa, Asia and the Caribbean, and contributes to the United Nations development agencies in this work, as well as to international agencies such as the Red Cross.

To date, Canada has financing 205 projects in social welfare. The trend shows only an average increase since 1961 in developing countries to certain other categories. This trend reflects increased interest in developing countries but more emphasis on social needs and economic aspects of development.

The non-government side of Canadian social welfare is considered. Historically, the bi-lateral contributions were made by the public, which are now largely by mainly-donations from individuals. The latest records indicate that over 70 private organizations and agencies are involved in the big programme, with a total annual budget of a just \$30 million.
