### Market Situation and Outlook

- Prices of spiny lobster supplied from such sources as Australia and other countries went up substantially in 1992. These increased prices contributed to the substitution of spiny lobster with Canadian lobster in the live and frozen lobster markets.
- The economic slow down has been causing a considerable decrease in the quantity of very expensive items used in the food service sector. According to trade, each hotel and restaurant purchase of lobster has been decreasing and trade have been endeavouring to maintain sales quantities of lobster at the same level as in 1992 by increasing the number of customers, i.e., outlets.
