

CHRISTOPHER CAMPBELL EBERTS

Mr. Eberts was born in Montreal on May 5, 1913, and was educated at Bishop's University and at Oxford, where he was a Rhodes Scholar in 1938. He joined the Department of External Affairs in 1940 and served with the Canadian Legation to the Allied Governments, London, at the Canadian Embassy, Mexico City, and as the Department's Member and Canadian Secretary on the Permanent Joint Board on Defence.

Mr. Eberts later served as Consul General in San Francisco, before his appointment in 1960 as High Commissioner to Pakistan. In Ottawa he was Co-ordinator of Arrangements for the Royal Visit in 1964 and then Head, Protocol Division, and Chairman of the Government Hospitality Committee until his appointment as Ambassador to Iran in 1967, where he served until his retirement last February.

Mr. Eberts is married and has three children.

JAMES GEORGE

Mr. George was born in Toronto on September 14, 1918. He studied at the Universities of Grenoble and Toronto and was a Rhodes scholar. He saw naval service during the war and was discharged as a Lieutenant-Commander in 1945.

Mr. George joined the Department of External Affairs the same year and has served in several posts abroad. He was High Commissioner to Ceylon and Minister, Canadian Embassy, Paris, before his appointment as High Commissioner to India and Ambassador to Nepal in 1967. In Ottawa he was head of European Division from 1964 to 1966.

Mr. George is married and has three children.
