PRAYERS.

Mr. Macdonald (Rosedale) for Mr. Greene, seconded by Mr. Turner (Ottawa-Carleton), by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-190, An Act to amend the National Energy Board Act, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The text of the Message and Recommendation of the Governor General printed pursuant to Standing Order 62(2) in relation to the foregoing Bill is as follows:

His Excellency the Governor General recommends to the House of Commons a measure to amend the National Energy Board Act to increase the National Energy Board from five to seven members; to provide for their minimum salaries and for the appointment of an Associate Vice-Chairman of the Board; to change the method of appointing the Board's Secretary and of fixing his term of employment; and to provide further for a number of amendments in connection with the administration of the Act.

The following bill from the Senate was read the first time and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House:

Bill S-14, An Act respecting the sale and importation of certain radiation emitting devices.—*Mr. Munro.*
