PRAYERS.

Mr. Langlois, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Consumer and Corporate Affairs, laid upon the Table,—Report of the Prices and Incomes Commission entitled "Tin Plate", John H. Young, Esq., (Chairman) dated April 10, 1970. (English and French).—Sessional Paper No. 7/15A.

Mr. Macdonald (Rosedale) for Mr. Davis, seconded by Mr. Olson, by leave of the House, introduced Bill C-204, An Act to amend the Fisheries Act, which was read the first time and ordered to be printed and ordered for a second reading at the next sitting of the House.

The Order being read for the consideration of the Business of Supply;

Pursuant to Standing Order 58, Mr. Broadbent, seconded by Mr. Knowles (Winnipeg North Centre), moved,—That this House condemns the Government (a) for its failure to provide a program of full employment, (b) for its discriminatory and ineffective manpower policies, and (c) for its destructive labour relations with its own employees.

And debate arising thereon;

Mr. Muir (Cape Breton-The Sydneys), seconded by Mr. Ricard, moved in amendment thereto,—That the motion be amended by adding thereto the following:

"And particularly the failure of the government to provide freight rate subsidization in the Atlantic provinces, where unemployment rates are twice the national average, in order to relieve against the hardship of high prices and unemployment."

After debate thereon, proceedings on the motion expired.
